Summer 2020 Front Office Hours

Currently, the YES Prep West Front Office is only open virtually Monday – Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. These hours will continue through the start of the new school year.

Retention / Promotion Decisions

Middle School:

If a middle school student is being reviewed by the Retention Placement Committee (formally Grade Placement Committee) and is at risk for being retained due to not meeting the YES Prep Middle School Promotion standards guardians will be informed by Thursday, May 29th.

High School:

High School Promotion, Placement and Retention decision will be made by the campus and communicated to parents/guardians by Thursday, May 29th A high school student who has failed 1 or more semesters of a core class may be required to enroll in Summer Credit Recovery to be promoted or placed into the next grade level. If successful completion of Summer Credit Recovery is required for the student to be promoted or placed, a second parent/guardian meeting will be held at the start of the 2020-2021 School Year to communicate final Retention and Placement decisions based on successful completion of Summer Credit Recovery.

High School Credit Recovery:

The YES Prep Credit Recovery Program is for students currently enrolled in 9th – 12th grade and is designed to help students regain credits, persist, stay on-track to graduate and go to college. Most core English, Math, Science, and Social Studies courses will be offered. Foreign language courses will not be offered. YES Prep Summer Credit Recovery will be offered virtually through the Edmentum PLATO Platform with a YES Prep Staff member assigned to support your student virtual through Teams. Due to the implications of COVID-19, this summer we will waive all Summer Credit Recovery fees and it will be offered free of charged to students. Students must successfully complete the program by the last day, July 1, to receive credit for the course. Failure to finish or earn a passing grade will result in the student retaking the course next year and possible retention. Students that attend Summer Credit Recovery will be required to attend a live online training during the week of June 1 with a parent or guardian. More information will follow for students that are registered.

Summer Assignments

At YES Prep West course-specific summer assignments are limited to AP Courses. Below is an overview of the AP Summer Coursework for each AP Course.

Students who will be enrolled in these courses will be invited to a Microsoft Team called "YP West AP Summer Coursework". There they will find a channel for each course and the designated assignment, including all instructions, attachments, and links. The team will be monitored by teachers and administrators throughout the summer so students should feel free to post any questions they have!

Course	Assignment Overview
AP Gov't	Read and annotate each of the summarized section of the Constitution. Respond to the discussion questions for each of the aforementioned sections in complete sentences.
AP Spanish Language	Spend 15-20 minutes per day surrounding yourself with the Spanish language! You can talk to family, friends, and/or neighbors who speak Spanish, or read/listen to/watch one of the many suggestions I've provided at <u>www.tinyurl.com/estudiosdeverano</u> . Make a list of at least 50 new words you've learned and define at least 25 of them (in Spanish!)
AP US History	Read and annotate Ch. 1-2 from the "AP US History: Preparing for the Advanced Placement Exam" Textbook. Then, respond to the discussion questions at the end of each chapter in complete sentences.
AP Psychology	 Assignment #1 – Intro to Psychology: Crash Course Psychology #1 (Video) Watch the video and complete the guided notes and reflections that pair with this video. This will give you a general introduction to the topic of Psychology. Assignment #2 – AP Psychology 1.1 Introducing Psychology (Video) Watch the video and complete the guided note and reflections that pair with this video. This will give you a more specific introduction to the focus of AP Psychology specifically from the College Board source!
AP Physics	 Task 1: Read Intro to Physics & Motion Reading and answer reflection questions Task 2: Mini Velocity Lab: Find an object of your choice, measure how far it travels in a specific amount of time! Task 3: Reasoning Practice: take a look at the 3 diagrams and write your reasonings for any conclusion that you think of (CER) Task 4: Everyday Physics: Pick two objects and rank 1-10 how well you think you understand the physics and write a short paragraph Task 5: Procrastination and work habits reading and answer reflection questions



AP English Language	Select a book from the list provided by Mr. De Leon (make sure you sign up for it using the SignUpGenius link) and read it carefully over the summer. When we begin school, we will start with a unit that will depend on your understanding of your book. Be prepared to discuss it with your peers and to write a process paper over it.
AP Calc	Log into Delta Math and complete all assigned modules. Each problem has an example with steps explained. Modules range from basic algebra skills up through precal. Each set has an indicated number of problems that must be completed. Once there is a green check mark next to the title of the module, you are complete! Ms. Patel will be able to track your progress, so reach out with any questions.

2020-21 Student Fees



Legal guardians should expect to pay various student fees throughout the year depending on the student's participation in special programming. YES Prep has worked to standardize student fees across campuses and ensure fees being charged to students are aligned with compliance expectations and YES Prep philosophy.

These are some general parameters applied to student fees:

- Students should not be charged a fee for items that have no cost.
- Students should not be charged a fee for items or services that benefits staff members.
- Cost inflation should not be variable for items with a fixed cost. i.e. ID badges should cost the same at all locations
- Maximum cost formulas may never exceed base price + 2%.
- Student fees for specific activities may change from year to year because they are based on a percentage of cost. Campuses will communicate specific fee amounts based on the parameters above as cost for items and programs are finalized.

These are **some** fees families should plan to pay throughout the next school year. Exact amounts will be shared with campuses as they are finalized. This list is not exhaustive, and there may be fees not included below:

- Advanced Placement test fees (for 8-12 grade students taking an AP exam)
- Trip fees (may include day trips and/or overnight trips)
- Athletic fees (applicable to students who participate in athletic programming)

YES Prep Atlas and Other Reading Materials

The YES Prep Atlas is the scope of books, novels, short stories, and other readings students will be assigned to read each year in English classes. The YES Prep Atlas can be found on the "For Parents" section of Yesprep.org. All required reading materials will be provided by the campus for students. Required reading materials such as novels, Spanish anthologies, or SAT prep materials will be provided for students at no cost to the family.

2020-21 School Supply List

A complete list of school supplies will be available in early August for the 2020-2021 school year on our website and will be shared on social media. This will include the specific binder or composition notebooks needed for each course.

All students, in all grade levels, should have the general school supplies throughout the school year: pencils, blue/black pens, red pens, highlighters, dry-erase markers, erasers, 3-4 folders, lined paper, and a combination lock for their locker.

All 8-12th grade students are required to have a TI-Nspire graphing calculator for math class. (Do not purchase a "CAS" version as it is not allowable on assessments.)

Re-enrollment will take place in July 2020 through Skyward (the new YES Prep Student Information System). Families will receive more details closer to July for re-enrollment requirements.

Uniforms



YES Prep Public Schools believes in the power of community and school pride while also deeply valuing a student's right to express their individuality without the fear of unnecessary discipline, body shaming, or the confines of gender norms. Students have the right to be treated equitably and dress code enforcement at YES Prep Public Schools will not create disparities, reinforce or increase the marginalization of any group, nor will it be unfairly enforced more strictly against a student because of racial identity, ethnicity, gender expression, sexual orientation, cultural or religious identity, household income, body size or type, or body maturity.

YES Prep Public Schools uniform policy is centered around values of equity and school pride. A school uniform allows for community building and options within the uniform selection allows for student and family choice. Uniforms should be worn each school day and should meet the expectations of district and campus guidelines. Similar to all YES Prep policies, if a student's uniform, dress, or accessory choice poses a concern for student physical or emotional safety, a campus administrator has the discretion to disallow the uniform item.

A uniform shirt is defined as either a campus polo, sold by YES Prep Public Schools, containing the current school logo, and is the correct color for the student's campus or additional shirts distributed by the student's school for specified days.

YES Prep Public Schools also has winter jackets, sweatshirts, and cardigans for sale to provide multiple options for outwear. A student's outerwear may only be YES Prep and may also include outerwear sold by the athletics department on campus.

We will share more on our uniform options, purchase processes, and daily policy expectations in July, 2020. Please know that given the unknown nature of COVID and potential financial implications, we are committed to being flexible with the uniform policy in order to be responsive to family needs during this time.

2020-21 Transportation

As we prepare for the upcoming school year, student safety is our top priority. The YES Prep Transportation Department is following updated cleaning and capacity guidelines that are being shared by local and state officials. With these new guidelines in mind, it is important that we know which students want to use bus transportation when we reopen. In order to do so, we have created this <u>survey</u>, which will allow you to sign up for transportation. We will use the information from this <u>survey</u> to assign bus routes to students that meet the guidelines listed on the YES Prep <u>website</u> to ensure that all safety measures are being taken.
