



YES Prep West Secondary School Parent and Family Engagement Policy ESSA Section 1116 2020-2021

 - (B) families are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school;
 - (C) families are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child; and
 - (D) other activities are carried out, such as those described in Section 1116 of the ESSA.

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

YES Prep West will utilize our numerous communication systems (Family Notes, Family Portal, social media, What's App, Alpha Pack) as well as direct invites to involve families in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs. During scheduled parent engagement meetings throughout the year, YES Prep West families will have the opportunities to offer feedback on regular meeting times, if requested by families, suggestions for improvement and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as possible. YES Prep West administration will post a revised copy of the handbook based on feedback and agreed upon changes to the Families page of the YES Prep West website.

Family Notes detail the current priorities of the campus, as well as communication as to how the campus is moving forward as a PACK. Family Portal is an application that allows our campus and stakeholders to intimately connect despite perceived language barriers. The West social media pages highlight current cultural activities and a focus on community. The Alpha Pack, the dedicated parent leaders from the ranks of our families, operate as West's liaisons that connect campus and off-campus community.

ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Opportunities for families to attend the campus' annual Title I meetings will be Monday, January 11th from 9 am-10 am, as well as the evening of January 11th from 5-6 pm. Differentiated times will allow families choice in attending and receiving information about the requirements of Title I and the school's participation, as well as the families' rights to be involved. The Annual Title I meeting will be used to ask for family input, provide an opportunity to digest and respond to information, and ensure families have access to the policy and compact. The meeting will also review the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact.

Professional development and region-wide conferences will include trainings regarding literacy, numeracy, early childhood development and parental engagement. Professional development trainings will also address how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with families as equal partners as well as how to create and begin parent programs, and build ties between families and the school.
